

Announcements

1. Welcome to all visitors, members and friends of St. Nectarios Orthodox Church. If you are a visitor, please sign the Guest Register in the church narthex. Only those Orthodox Christians who have prepared themselves may receive Holy Communion.

3. The Holy Feast of Pascha ended on Wednesday, May 16. We no longer use the usual Paschal greeting "Christ is Risen!" nor sing the Paschal Tropar. Until Pentecost (May 27) we are in the time of the Feast of the Ascension of Christ. During this time (until the Feast of Pentecost, the usual greeting is: "*Christ is ascended!*" and the usual response is: "*Into heaven!*"

4. The Parish Council will meet today following Divine Liturgy, in the church.

5. Next Sunday is the Feast of Pentecost, observing the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles fifty days after the Resurrection of Christ. At the end of Liturgy that day, we say the Kneeling Prayers, ending the ban on kneeling during the time after Pascha. The week following Pentecost is a fast-free week, in preparation for the Sts. Peter and Paul fast that begins June 4 and ends June 29, the Feast Day of the Saints.
