Announcements

- **1. Welcome to all visitors**, members and friends of St. Nectarios Orthodox Church. If you are a visitor, please sign the Guest Register in the church narthex. Only those Orthodox Christians who have prepared themselves may receive Holy Communion.
- **2. During this time** of pastoral vacancy, if you are in immediate emergency need of a priest, you may call the Very Rev. Fr. Harry Linsinbigler, pastor of Holy Protection Church in Dover, at 813-406-2620 or (if no answer) 813-451-9829.
- 3. With the conclusion of the fifty days of Pascha, kneeling and prostrating may once again be practiced tomorrow. A brief form of "Kneeling Vespers" will be served at the end of today's Liturgy. This is the Vespers that begins the Feast of the Holy Spirit on Monday, served usually on Sunday evening. Thus these Kneeling Prayers end the no-kneeling requirement during the season of Pascha. There is never any kneeling permitted on Sundays.
- **4. The week following Pentecost** is a fast-free week, in preparation for the Sts. Peter and Paul fast that begins June 4 and ends June 29, the Feast Day of the Saints. This fast is one of two lesser fasts during the year (the other being the Dormition fast of August 1-14). The Peter and Paul fast is generally observed in our diocese as a meat fast, but may be observed as a fast from the traditional oil, dairy and meat.
